Dear Father Tojeira and All the Family, Friends and Colleagues of Father Dean Brackley:

I wish that I could be with all of you today at the Mass celebrating the life of our beloved Father Dean Brackley.

Dean was and is one of my heroes. For me, he embodied the very best America has to offer the world. He touched so many lives, and now he lives on in us. He joins Monseñor Oscar Romero, my friends the martyred Jesuits, the four U.S. churchwomen, and so many Salvadorans as a beacon of integrity and hope. He will always be "presente" in our lives and work.

He was a good and beautiful man. I will miss him.
